

- 4. The prophet Zechariah foretold that the Messiah (Jesus) would enter Jerusalem riding on a donkey—a prophecy fulfilled by Jesus during His triumphal entry (Zechariah 9:9; Matthew 21:1-11).
- 5. The prophet Isaiah also foretold that it was God's will for the Messiah (Jesus) to be offered as sacrifice for the sins of mankind (Isaiah 53:10).

- 6. He also foretold that the Messiah (Jesus) would be despised and rejected by His own people (Isaiah 53:3).
- 7. The prophet Isaiah also foretold that the Messiah (Jesus) would suffer for our sins, carrying our pain and punishment so that we could be healed and made whole (Isaiah 53:4-5).
- 8. It was also foretold by the prophet Isaiah that the Messiah (Jesus) would be oppressed and afflicted, yet remain silent before His accusers, like a lamb led to the slaughter (Isaiah 53:7).
- 9. He also foretold that the Messiah (Jesus) would die for the sins of mankind and bearing the judgment that was meant for us (Isaiah 53:8).
- 10. The prophet Isaiah also foretold that the Messiah (Jesus) would be buried in a rich man's tomb, despite being treated like a criminal in death (Isaiah 53:9; Matthew 27:57-60).


Scripture Reading-Romans 5:17






"Death-Free" In Christ

I'm full of power by the Spirit of God. I heal the sick, live in victory, and nothing can hurt me! Hallelujah!






Jesus Loves Without Conditions

God Sees The Heart

Jeremiah 17:10

I, the LORD, search the heart, I test the mind, even to give every man according to his ways, according to the fruit of his doings.



When you serve God or help others, what matters most is not only what you do but why you do it. God looks beyond outward actions—He searches the heart.

In 1 Samuel 16, when Samuel came to Jesse's house to anoint a new king, he saw tall and strong sons who looked like kings. But God didn't choose any of them. Then young David was called in. Though he didn't look like a king, God said, "This is the one!" Why? Because David's heart pleased the Lord (Acts 13:22 CEV).


A Cheerful Giver








Stand Strong For Jesus
